

# WORLDS AT WAR

## IBM PC TECHNICAL SUPPLEMENT

### **Starting, Saving & Exiting Game** **Installing the program**

---

**Installation instructions for IBM-PC Compatible computers equipped with 1 or 2 floppy disks and/or hard disk.**

---

#### **Installing on floppies**

---

If yours is a floppy only system, or if you don't wish to install the game on your hard drive, you can easily play 'World at Wars' from floppies.

No installation is required for floppies. however, you should back up your game diskette and use the copy, not the distribution disk, for playing. See your sytem's user manual for instructions on how to copy diskettes.

If you decide to use your distribution disk, and destroy it accidentally, we'll be glad to replace it for a £5.00 fee. A word to the wise is sufficient.

#### **Installing on Hard Disk**

---

To install on your hard disk, do the following:

- . Insert the game disk in A: drive (you can also use your B: drive, if necessary)
- . Type **A:INSTALL C:**

The game will be installed in the directory c:\worlds. The game can be installed on drive D: or any other hard drive designator. Simply follow the install command with the proper drive letter.

For example, to install from your B: drive to your D: drive, type **B:INSTALL D:**

#### **Booting the program**

---

**'Worlds at War' can be started from floppies or from your hard disk. The program tries to detect your video card type, but can be overridden. Some possible problems and their solutions.**

---

#### **Booting from floppies**

---

To start 'Worlds at War' from floppies, do the following:

- . Boot your computer with an MS-DOS disk
- . Place your backup program disk in drive A:
- . At the A:> prompt, type: **WORLDS**, then press <ENTER>

#### **Booting from hard disk**

---

To start 'Worlds at War' from your hard disk, do the following:

- . Boot your computer normally
- . To switch to the game directory, type: **CD C:\WORLDS**
- . To start the game, type: **WORLDS**, then press <ENTER>

## **Display resolution**

---

'Worlds at War' has been designed to detect the type of video card installed in your machine. In most cases, this works fine. If this auto-detection doesn't work on your machine, it can be overridden on the command line.

If your video display is:

- CGA then type **WORLDS/C**
- Hercules then type **WORLDS/H**
- EGA then type **WORLDS/E:4**
- VGA then type **WORLDS/E:5**

These are the only display modes currently supported.

## **Problems with booting**

---

Memory allocation error - if you get this error while booting, you don't have enough memory available to run the program. Some things to check:

- . Do you have at least 512K of memory?
  - . Do you load memory resident programs, like SideKick, when booting?
- If you do, you will have to boot with a plain MS-DOS disk to play the game.

## **Finding and entering the password**

---

**Before you can begin to play, you must find a password in the manual and type it into the password control line.**

## **Internecine's protection philosophy ...**

---

Copy protection is an inconvenient but necessary component of every game. Nevertheless, we think that you should be able to backup your game disk or copy the game to your hard drive. Therefore we have protected this game with a simple password system. There is no disk-based protection, so you should have no fear of copying the game to your hard disk.

Please, if you have any respect for the rights of others, don't attempt to break the password system or make copies of the manual.

## **How to find the right password**

---

To locate the password in the manual, do the following:

- 1 Find the page indicated in the Password Control Line.
- 2 Find the correct paragraph by counting paragraphs from the top of the page. Paragraphs are separated by blank lines. The heading and the summary paragraph are not counted.
- 3 Locate the word in the paragraph by counting. The seventh word in this paragraph is 'password'.
- 4 Type in the word without capitals.
- 5 Press the Enter Key.
